My parents told me that this might be a small Christmas, because of the medical bills that they were dealing with. Regardless of all of that "grown-up stuff," I grew more excited, by the day. One of the highlights of every Christmas, was the present that I always received from my Uncle Marvin. He was like a second Daddy to me and he always gave the best gifts.

The day came and Uncle Marvin was due any minute, and my excitement was overflowing. I was apparently extremely annoying to my mother, because she told me to get still and sit down somewhere. What could he have gotten for me that required a strong wooden box to carry it in? He and Daddy took the box from the truck, and took it inside of the house. I was beside myself, wanting, speculating and anticipating the amazing gift that must be inside of this sturdy frame. We got inside, and I am jumping around like a bug on a hot rock, and Uncle Marvin said, "What do you think?" I said, "Can I open it?" "Sure!" So, the long awaited time had come; I slowly removed the wooden lid from this treasure box, only to find a box full of empty. Where was the present? Uncle Marvin said, "How do you like it?" Like what? I thought to myself. There is nothing inside. Then the reality became clear! This red wooden box with the heavy wooden lid was THE PRESENT!

Having been brought up to be grateful, or at least show it, I said "Thank you Uncle Marvin." Inside, I was saying, "Where are my toys that you always give?" Christmas passed, and the wooden disappointment sat in the corner of my room,

Food For Thought-Where Is Your Bethlehem?

Joseph went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem...He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. Luke 2:4, 5

As the crow flies, it was a journey of approximately 100 kilometers but traveling over hills, through villages and around rivers would likely have made the trip even longer. Christmas pictures always show Mary riding a donkey, but we really have no idea of their mode of travel. In any case, whether on foot or on the back of a swaying brown animal, it wasn't an easy journey, especially for a women nearing the end of her pregnancy. Why did she go? True, government officialdom decreed a census and that everyone must go to one's "own city," the place their families called home, for this official registration and counting. Perhaps Mary was also quite ready to leave the village of Nazareth where tongues were wagging about her pregnancy and unmarried status. But Mary and Joseph knew they were going far from family and into a city whose streets would be clogged with traveling strangers. They were assured of no warm welcome, no cozy place to birth the expected child. Perhaps they hoped for a small house or a distant relative or a way for Joseph to earn money for their keep, but in almost every way, they were traveling into the unknown. The journey was long and hard, the destination uncertain. Nearly nine months before their arrival in Bethlehem, Mary spoke lifechanging words to God, words that were to comfort her in the many uncertain years ahead. "I am the Lord's servant. May it be to me as you have said." With those simple words of faith, she could endure the long journey on the back of a donkey, the cold streets of Bethlehem, the staring faces of strangers, and even the crude stable with its straw-lined manger. Where is your Bethlehem? Has the path been long, the people uncaring, the circumstances burdensome? When we submit ourselves as servants to a loving God, we can—in quietness and confidence—add "May it be to me as you have said" no matter the place or position in which we find ourselves. From the Administrative Team

The 2016 Baptist Tabernacle Church Missions Budget will be presented for approval in a Special called Church Conference on December 16, 2015.

Budget in this case is a noun, defined as

- 1. an estimate, often itemized, of expected income and expense for a given period in the future.
- 2. a plan of operations based on such an estimate.
- 3. an itemized allotment of funds, time, etc., for a given period.
- 4. the total sum of money set aside or needed for a purpose, i.e., budgeted items.

Earlier this year, we provided some detailed information relative to the responsibilities of the Administrative Team. One of these responsibilities is the preparation of the annual Church Budget. This is one of the most important activities of the Administrative Team and the Church. Without an effective budget, it is difficult to administer the finances of the Church. Preparing the Church budget is similar to a business preparing its budget and similar to families preparing their family budget. First of all, we ask the various Ministry Teams for their input on what they expect to spend and if they plan on having any fundraisers during the year. We then look at the current year expenses of the Church and estimate what they will be at the end of the year. We then begin the arduous task of estimating our budget. Although the Ministry Teams have requests for their expenses for the year, the Administrative Team has the responsibility to ensure the

Church remains fiscally responsible for the monies that the Church has to spend. As we all know, <u>you can't spend more than you receive</u>, so this is a very important task. Not only does the Administrative Team develop the budget, they also monitor it throughout the year to assure that the spending is within allowable limits so as not to overspend.

Since we do not have the Family Ministry Center Mortgage in the upcoming year, we still need to be careful with our spending. There are lots of wants within the Church for various projects so we must evaluate the wants and determine which are really needs and then prioritize those needs to ensure that we are spending the money wisely.

Let's keep these items in mind as the Administrative Team prepares the annual budget and as we meet and vote on the annual Church Budget in December. Please be in prayer for the Administrative Team as we prepare the budget and for the Church as we vote on the annual budget.



Character of the Bible-Joseph

(Matthew 1:19-25) – Not much is said about Joseph in the gospels, but what is said shows that he was a righteous and obedient person. When Joseph got the news that Mary was pregnant he knew he wasn't the father and wanted to call off the wedding and separate. But he had a dream from God and was commanded to go on with his plans to marry Mary. If he did that it is natural that people would consider Joseph the father and he would likely face some shame and criticism as some people would assume that he slept with Mary before they got married. Also if Joseph married Mary Jesus, as the firstborn son, would be entitled to Joseph's estate, though Joseph wasn't really the father. Joseph may have to give his estate to someone who wasn't really his son. In history three other Israelites refused to marry a woman for just that reason (Ruth's closest relative,

and Judah's two oldest sons). The birthright was very important as was the family line and most fathers would want to protect that. However, Joseph put all those consequences aside and simply obeyed. Sometimes obedience comes at a price. But Joseph decided to please God rather than men. We also need to be obedient no matter the cost. (Source - Calligraphy for God)


