

From the Administrative Team

One of the continuing efforts of the Administrative Team is the maintenance and update of the Constitution & By-Laws. In the past, we have written Newsletter Articles that summarized each of the Articles of the Constitution & By-Laws to help familiarize all Church members with the principles of our faith and the operation of the Church. These principles and rules of operation sometimes get by-passed or forgotten in the day to day operation of the Church. There-

fore, this Newsletter Article is a reminder of those. We must look at the PREAMBLE of the Constitution & By-Laws to understand the premise of having a group of guidelines. That PREAMBLE states:

"We declare and establish this Constitution for the preservation and security of the princi-

ples of our faith, and so that the body may be governed in an orderly manner. This Constitution will preserve the liberties of each individual member of this Church and the freedom of action of this body in its relation to other Churches of the same faith and beliefs."

What this is saying it that this set of rules and guidelines that we call our Constitution & By-Laws is what we use to ensure that our principles of the Baptist Faith is maintained and that we are governed in an orderly manner. All organizations that have specific beliefs, goals, and standards must have established rules and guidelines to follow or there will certainly be no organization at all. This includes governments, businesses, clubs, civic organizations, and churches, as well as others.

If you want to know about our Church meetings, refer to Article II of the Constitution. If you want to know about the Church Officers, Program Leaders, and Leadership Teams refer to Article III. If you want to know how to call or dismiss a Pastor, refer to Article III Sections 3 and 5. To elect a Deacon, refer to Article IV. What does it take to be a Church Member? Refer to Article V. What about Baptism, Communion, or Burial? They are all covered in the Constitution. What about Adoption and Amendments of the Constitution? This is covered by Article XI. We also cover General Church Policies which includes such items as a memorial Gift Policy, Guidelines for use of the Buildings, as well as Financial Policies and Procedures.

Without this set of rules and guidelines, the basic operation of this Church would be without any general direction. How would we elect a Deacon? When would we hold Communion? Who could be buried in the Church cemetery?

We know to the general Church member it seems that all these things get done and the Church operates without a hitch. But that is not the case. The Leadership of the Church ensures that the rules and policies of the Church are complied with and all the operations of the Church are seamless. That is what the Church is aiming for and that is the reason the Church established a set of operating instructions...the Constitution & By-Laws. Our challenge to each and every Church member, whether you are a Deacon, Ministry Team Leader, Sunday School Teacher, or you just attend Worship Service, is to get a copy of the Constitution & By-Laws, read them, understand them, and abide with them. This will assist with the smooth operations of the Church. And if there is anything that you don't understand, please ask a member of the Administrative Team for some assistance. You may find something that needs revising; if so bring it to the Administrative Team. We will utilize the guidance of Article XI to make any necessary changes!

Inspirational People-Franklin Graham

Franklin Graham has devoted his life to meeting the needs of people around the world and proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The elder son of Billy and Ruth Bell Graham, he has served as president and CEO of Samaritan's Purse since 1979 and as president and CEO of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association since 2001.

Under his leadership, Samaritan's Purse has met the needs of poor, sick, and suffering people in more than 100 countries. As an evangelist for the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, he has led crusades around the world.

William Franklin Graham III, born July 14, 1952, is the fourth of five children of evangelist Billy Graham and his wife, the late Ruth Bell Graham. Raised in a log home in the Appalachian Mountains outside Asheville, N.C., Franklin now lives in the mountains of Boone, North Carolina, with his wife, Jane Graham. They have four children, Will, Roy, Edward and Cissie, and 10 grandchildren.

He was born into a heritage rich in Christian ministry. By the time of Franklin's birth, Billy Graham was already known around the world as a spiritual leader, but he wasn't the only spiritual giant in the family. Franklin's maternal grandfather, Lemuel Nelson Bell, was a medical missionary to China for more than 20 years, a respected moderator of his denomination, the Presbyterian Church in the United States, and a co-founder and executive editor of Christianity Today.

In his autobiography, Rebel with a Cause, Franklin explained that "just being the son of Billy Graham won't get me into heaven." He knew that he was being called to do more with his life and to make a real commitment to God. So at age 22, after a period of rebellion and traveling the world, Franklin committed his life to Jesus Christ while alone in a hotel room in Jerusalem. Soon after that, Dr. Bob Pierce, founder of Samaritan's Purse (and World Vision), invited Franklin to join him on a six-week mission to Asia. It was during that time that Franklin felt a calling to work with hurting people in areas of the world affected by war, famine, disease, and natural disasters.




