### From the Pastor's Desk

### Beginning Again Jeremiah 18:1-6

The word which came to Jeremiah from the Lord saying, "Arise and go down to the potter's house, and there I will announce My words to you." Then I went down to the potter's house, and there he was, making something on the wheel. But the vessel that he was making of clay was spoiled in the hand of the potter; so he remade it into another vessel, as it pleased the potter to make. Then the word of the Lord came to me saying, "Can I not, O house of Israel, deal with you as this potter does?" declares the Lord. "Behold, like the clay in the potter's hand, so are you in My hand, O house of Israel."

Many of us today and many people you know need a new beginning. God is the God of second chances and God is the God of new beginnings. Have you ever wished you could go back and start over? Maybe because of decisions that you made that created the situation that you are experiencing. IF only you could take the words back that you said, if only you could make different choices. Sadly, in most cases, it is impossible to go back and change what has been said or done. There is however one area of your life that you can have a new beginning: Your spiritual life can have a FRESH NEW START! What do you need today? God Specializes in New Beginnings. God used a unique manner to teach Jeremiah a valuable lesson. Jeremiah is a true prophet with the people's best interests at heart. At this time, he is very discouraged, and about to give up on God's people. He seemed to think God had done all He could and now there was no hope. God told him to go down to the pottery for an object lesson. There he saw a potter at the wheel intently shaping a vessel. The potter's foot was on the treadle moving the wheel around and around as the potter shaped the vessel. But just as the vessel seemed to be taking shape and becoming lovely, something unexpected happened: the vessel was marred. We are not sure just why, but it was marred. Jeremiah probably thought the potter would reject the crumpled clay as if the material was now of no value. Instead he flatten it again, put it back on the wheel and

### From the Administrative Team

Happy New Year from the Administrative Team! With the beginning of the New Year, we also have the beginning of a new Church year. This includes a new annual Church Missions Budget that was approved at the Special Called December Church Conference. This gives us all, as Church members, a renewed responsibility. A responsibility to be aware of the budgeted items approved by the Church and to ensure that we follow the approved budget. This message reminds me of some Glen's sermons when he mentions that he continues to preach about the same things over and over. As he calls it...repetition! That's right, if we repeat the importance of following the budget and the guidelines of spending the Church's money, maybe it will sink in with all the members. Remember, no money is spent without the Church's approval! I know that some don't like this. We are always used to spending our money whenever we want and however we want. Yet, this is not the case with the Church's money. That money is given with the intent of being used for the uplifting of God's kingdom to the Church and the Church must approve the spending of the money. Therefore, just remember that the Church must approve of all money spent. Again, this is included in the Constitution & By-Laws on page 74, where the Financial Policies and Procedures are spelled out. These Policies and Procedures were approved by the Church and are to be followed. It is important that we all follow the Policies and Procedures because no one individual has the responsibility to collect the income for the Church and no one individual has the responsibility or right to spend the money for the Church. No matter how important you may think it is to purchase something or spend some money for the Church, it must first be approved by the Church to be spent. If we do not have rules and procedures on spending of money, there will be no control on the money being spent. With no controls, we may not have the needed money available to pay our committed bills, such as salaries, utilities, literature, etc. So, the next time you decide to spend some money for a budgeted item, remember that it must be approved by the Church prior to spending.

On a different subject, with the beginning of a new budget, we move to a new era for the Church; one where we no longer have a mortgage to pay off. In September, we paid off the mortgage for the Family Ministry Center. With that, the budget was reduced by \$53,500 per year. That was a major accomplishment for the Church and we should be very proud of that accomplishment. However, we now have a new challenge! We now have a challenge to maintain our tithes and offerings so the Church can use that money in other areas. Don't forget that we are a missionary Baptist Church, Baptist Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church. We would like to use the money for missions work, both local and foreign. Let's remember this during the upcoming year.



### **Inspirational People**

### **Dr. Charles F. Stanley**

Charles F. Stanley is the founder of In Touch Ministries and a *New York Times* best-selling author. While his teaching is transmitted throughout the world to millions of people, Dr. Stanley has been said to demonstrate a practical, keen awareness of people's needs and provide Christ-centered, biblically -based principles for everyday life.

Dr. Stanley's motivation is best represented by the truth found in Acts 20:24, "Life is worth nothing unless I use it for doing the work assigned me by the Lord Jesus—the work of telling others the Good News about God's mighty kindness and love." This is because, as he says, "It is the Word of God and the work of God that changes people's lives."

Charles Frazier Stanley is born. Charley and Rebecca Stanley gave birth to a son in Dry Fork, Virginia. Dr. Stanley earned a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Southwester Theological Seminary in 1957, and his

first pastorate was at Fruitland Baptist Church in North Carolina. In 1968 he received a Masters of Theology from Luther Rice Seminary. He became the 16<sup>th</sup> pastor of First Baptist Atlanta and in 1971 received a Doctorate of Theology from Luther Rice Seminary. In 1977: An outreach ministry is founded and Dr. Stanley decides to call it "In Touch," which comes from a Living Bible he owned.

Dr. Stanley was inducted into the National Religious Broadcasters' (NRB) Hall of Fame. Dr. Stanley has authored more than 60 books, and has hit the *New York Times* Best Seller's List several times. (Source – In Touch.org)


