
Food For Thought

Recipe for a Happy New Year. . .

From the Administrative Team

Happy New Year from the Administrative Team! With the beginning of the New Year, we also have the beginning of a new Church year. This includes a new annual Church Missions Budget that was approved at the Special Called December Church Conference. This gives us all, as Church members, a renewed responsibility. A responsibility to be aware of the budgeted items approved by the Church and to ensure that we follow the approved budget. This message reminds me of some of Glen's sermons when he mentions that he continues to preach about the same things over and over. As he calls it ...repetition! That's right, if we repeat the importance of following the budget and the guidelines of spending the Church's money, maybe it will sink in with all the members. Remember, no money is spent without the Church's approval! I know that some don't like this. We all are accustomed to spending our money whenever we want and however we want. Yet, this is not the case with the Church's money. That money is given to the Church with the intent of it being used for the uplifting of God's kingdom. Therefore, the Church must approve of all money spent. Again, this is included in the Constitution & By-Laws on page 74, where the Financial Policies and Procedures are spelled out. These Policies and Procedures were approved by the Church and are to be followed. It is important that we all follow the Policies and Procedures because no one individual has the responsibility to collect the income for the Church and no one individual has the responsibility or right to spend the money for the Church. No matter how important you may think it is to purchase something or spend some money for the Church, it must first be approved by the Church to be spent. If we do not have rules and procedures on spending of money, there will be no control on the money being spent. With no controls, we may not have the needed money available to pay our committed bills, such as salaries, utilities, literature, etc. So, the next time you decide to spend some money for a budgeted item, remember that it must be approved by the Church prior to spending.

OK, enough of the soap box!! Let's focus on the New Year. We are blessed to see another year and look forward to see what the Lord brings to us this year. We have had an amazing Church growth in the past year and hope to continue that trend as we move into another year. Keep up the good work, Pastor Glen and Baptist Tabernacle!!



BTC Missions

Sonny Trippe gave us a very brief summary of our ongoing mission activities during the regular worship service on Sunday, December 11th. Your Mission Team wants you to be aware of what **YOU** have been doing to assist those in need within our community and nearby during the recent Christmas season. All made possible through your support of Fall Fest and designated giving to Community Missions. Highlights are:

You contributed \$10,000 to NC Missions (Baptist Men) and \$2500 to Kennedy Homes toward flood recovery.

You retrieved 10 children's names from Corinth Holder's Elementary School's Angel Tree and Archer Lodge's Middle School Angel Trees. Gifts for those specific children were purchased, gift wrapped, and delivered to their schools before Christmas.

You "adopted" four families from the community. We had helped these families earlier with clothes and household items from our Fall Fest residuals. These are hard-working families who just can not seem to get ahead and are in need of a little assistance. Gifts and a Christmas meal were provided for these families.

After Fall Fest, **You** helped several families in the community by encouraging their "free shopping" for clothing and household items left after our yard sale. Residual items have continued to be made available to those in need within our community.

You provided two vehicle loads of residual items from our yard sale to the Raleigh Moose Lodge's yard sale. All proceeds from their sale were used to purchase gifts for a North Raleigh/Rolesville Angel Tree Community.

You sent new coats, hats, gloves, and scarves to children who were victims of the flood in Lumberton. Here You were supporting an initiative by Katherine Batten.

Further, we recognized that while seasonal concern and giving from many sources were more readily available at this time of year, our "neighbors" will continue to need assistance long after the Christmas Season has come and gone. Accordingly, we expect to continue meeting needs within our community well into the new year. Thanks again for your continued support of our Mission activities at Baptist Tabernacle Church.


