### From the Missions Outreach Ministry Team

During the October Leadership Meeting, it was brought to our attention that a growing number of members designating "Community missions" on their weekly tithe envelopes. We thought it beneficial to make sure you are aware of how much of our financial giving at Baptist Tabernacle Church is being applied to demonstrating Christ's love through Missions. We want you to feel the pride that comes from knowing that your generous financial support is being felt in our community, across North Carolina, and around the World.

Within our immediate community, you support the efforts of many local organizations through Community Missions. These include: 323 Ministry, House of Hope of Johnston County, Smithfield Rescue mission, Good Neighbor House, harbor House, Clayton Area Ministries, Angel Tree of Johnson County, and other numerous WMU-sponsored outreach activities of our Johnson Baptist Association. Each quarter, your Mission Team determines the most pressing needs among these community organizations and makes a cash contribution to assist in meeting their immediate needs.

Within the state of North Carolina, you also support the work of our Baptist men I Disaster Relief, Lay Renewal, Church Planting, Construction Programs, Medical and Dental Ministries; just to name a few. Also in North Carolina, you support our Baptist Children's Home and our Baptist Hospitals. Our Global outreach ministry through Lottie Moon, Annie Armstrong and Samaritan's Purse-Operation Christmas Child donations continues to reach others for Christ beyond the borders of North Carolina.

These activities are so much a part of our culture at Baptist Tabernacle that you may not recognize how much you do contribute through special offering envelopes and Mission designated offerings. Just as a reminder, beginning in January of each calendar year, our Heck-Jones offering and Women's Missionary Union (WMU)\_ Week of Prayer results in the contribution of over \$500 to our NCWMU. In March of each year, our Annie Armstrong Easter Offering raises over \$2400 for North American Missions. In May, our Mother's Day Offering contributes over \$1400 to the work of NC Baptist Hospitals. In September of this year, you contributed over \$2400 to our NC Missions Program. In November, we will contribute over \$2500 in support of our NC Baptist Children's Homes. In December, our Lottie Moon Christmas Offering of over \$1200 will go to support missionaries around the world.

Right about now, you may well be thinking "How do I do all this?" You give every time you respond to our request for special emphasis giving almost every month of the year. You support the efforts of your Mission Team through a number of fundraiser. When you bake a cake for our BBQ or buy a raffle ticket at Fall Fest or make a donation to our Yard Sale or attend our Vendor Fair or have a "soup and Sandwich" lunch in the Family Ministry Center, you give. Each year our Church budget establishes monthly donations to other specific programs such as the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and Association Missions. These are funded by your regular Sunday tithes and offerings (cash and checks received in the Sunday Morning offerings and otherwise undesignated offerings in the Sunday School envelopes). You also give to meet local needs when you write "Community Missions" on your weekly tithe envelope.

"Thank You" for your continued generous support of the mission activities of our Baptist Tabernacle Church.

### From the Administrative Team

The end of the year is fast approaching. As a reminder to all the Ministry Teams, remember to check the latest Deposits and Disbursements. Spreadsheets to review the amounts left in your 2016 Budget. Monies budgeted in 2016 will not carry over to 2017. 2016 budgeted amounts are to be spent in 2016 and the amount to be spent in 2017 is to be established and voted on by the Church in the 2017 Budget. A special Church Conference will be called in December to vote on the 2017 Budget, since it will be effective January 1, 2017. Copies of the Deposits and Disbursements Spreadsheets along with the latest Checking Account Summary are placed in the vestibule of the Sanctuary monthly for you to pick up and review.

We mention this since it is November and we are working diligently on the Church Budget for 2017. This is always a challenging time of year for the Ministry Teams, The Administrative Team, and the Church. It is the time that we use to estimate the Church's income for the next year and what the expenditures are planned to be. We have asked each of the Ministry Team leaders to prepare a list of what their needs are for the upcoming year along with the justifications for those needs. Our goal is to balance the two so we can have an effective and balanced budget and determine the best and most accurate Budget for 2017. We use this information along with the expenditures in the past year to establish a budget. Again, this is not an easy task and requires a lot of work and discussion. We occasionally need to touch base with the Ministry Team leaders for additional information related to their specific needs. Hopefully, we can establish a budget that is satisfactory to each of the Ministry Teams, meets the needs of the Church, and still fit within the confines of the Church's income. As you well know as homeowners: you can't spend more than what you earn, so we need to balance this carefully. We try our best to determine a good estimate of what we will receive and as estimate of what we will spend.

As we work through this process during November, we ask the Church that you continue to be in prayer for the Ministry Teams, the Administrative Team, and the Church as we work our way through the process of establishing a realistic budget for the Church.

It shows her she is valued and loved. Most importantly, your offering gives us the greatest privilege of all—the opportunity to introduce children to THE GREAT I AM.

With 80% of the children coming to BCH unchurched and unreached, this offering makes it possible for them to hear the Gospel. The BCH ministered to 21, 876 children and adults in 2015.


