From the Administrative Team

A major accomplishment in the life of Baptist Tabernacle Church will be celebrated during our Homecoming Service on October 4th. The final payment on the mortgage for the Family Ministry Center was paid in September and the payoff of the Family Ministry Center will be celebrated with a burning of the note during the Homecoming Service. In 2001, Baptist Tabernacle Church had a vision to build a state of the art Family Ministry Center (FMC) to provide a center for worship, fellowship, and community. The Church entered into a Challenge to Build Program where Church members committed to three year specific donations to fund the initial building of the FMC. The Church Family had already saved \$300,000 and borrowed another

\$750,000, based on the commitments made by the Church members to fund the FMC. That vision became a reality in 2002 with the completion of the FMC and it has been serving the Church and Community for 13 years. This building has been a blessing to our Church and community and was truly a blessing from God to Baptist Tabernacle Church as well at the Church community. Please plan on attending the Homecoming Services and celebrate this momentous occasion of burning the note on the FMC!

Beginning October 1st, we will begin working on the

Church budget for 2016. The Administrative Team passed out budget request forms to the Ministry Team Leaders at the September Leadership Team meeting asking that they be returned at the October Leadership Team meeting. The Administrative Team does not develop the budget in a vacuum and needs input from the Church and the Ministry Team Leaders. What we ask is that each Ministry Team discuss your planned

expenses for 2016, along with any plans for fundraisers that you plan to have for the year. Then just turn that information over to The Administrative Team. The forms should include specific information for the expenses, such as; Youth Camp, mission expense, capital needs for the church buildings or specific church maintenance needs, etc., the month planned to spend that money, planned fundraisers with the goal (money

planned to raise) and the month of the fundraiser. These numbers are important so that The Administrative Team can ensure, from a cash flow perspective, that money is available when each Ministry Team needs to spend it. If you are involved in developing budget numbers, please take the responsibility serious. The way the Church spends the funds that God allows us to have is important in conducting God's work through the Church.

Character of the Bible-Noah

Noah is most famous for building an ark — a giant three-decked wooden box in which he, his family, and a whole bunch of animals ride out a massive flood that God sends to destroy humankind for its disobedience. God chooses Noah and his family to survive the deluge because Noah is "the most righteous in his generation."
